Tax-free IRA rollover can help HwH

Did you know you can use an IRA distribution to help Horses with Heart – and pay no tax on it? If you're age 70 ½ or older, here's how it works (be sure to consult your financial adviser):

You can donate up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA without being taxed on the distribution (withdrawal), and satisfy your required minimum distribution at the same time.

To get this benefit, your IRA rollover must go directly to Horses with Heart and not to you personally. Be sure your adviser, and your IRA administrator, understand your charitable intent.
